The No. 8 northwest gale or storm signal was issued at 1:40pm. This means that winds with mean speeds of 63 kilometers per hour or more are

"At 6pm, tropical storm Nalgae was centered about 120 kilometers south-southeast of

Hong Kong and is forecast to move northwest at about 10 kilometers per hour edging

closer to the vicinity of the Pearl River Estuary," said the city's meteorological agency.

"According to the latest forecast, Nalgae will edge closer to Hong Kong tonight as

compared with the previous forecast and will skirt within 100 kilometers of Hong

HONG KONG OBSERVATORY ISSUES NO.

Under the influence of the rainbands associated with Nalgae, showers over the territory are expected to become more frequent gradually tonight. The No. 8 gale or storm signal will remain in force before 10pm tonight. Nalgae will weaken further. Whether the No. 8 gale or storm signal is maintained

signal. Seas are very rough with swells. Members of the public are advised to stay away from the shoreline and not to engage in water sports. Earlier in the day, the Education Bureau announced that classes at all schools are

thereafter depends on the degree of weakening of Nalgae. If Nalgae weakens further

into a tropical depression, the observatory will issue a lower tropical cyclone warning


